

■ Turkey – Security Regulation

Dear Customer,

We would like to inform you that Turkish Customs have announced new provisions for inbound cargo which will come into effect **January 1, 2012**.

Advanced cargo declarations will be required for:

- **Cargo imported into Turkey**
- **Cargo transshipped via a Turkish port**

Advanced cargo declarations will not be required for FROB cargo (Foreign Cargo Remaining on Board), i.e. cargo which is discharged in a port outside Turkey after the vessel has called a Turkish port.

The regulation differentiates between deep sea and short sea container traffic. Advanced manifest transmission deadlines will be as follows:

- **Deep sea container traffic: 24 hours prior to loading at POL**
- **Short sea container traffic: 2 hours prior to arrival at 1st Turkish POD**

In order to comply with the regulation we will require complete and correct shipping instructions no later than at time of documentation closing which is stipulated in the Hapag-Lloyd Booking Confirmation.

Effective immediately please provide the **four digit HS Code per cargo item** and the **TAX ID for the Turkish based consignee and/or notify** in the shipping instructions.

In view of the additional cost and effort required to comply with this regulation Hapag-Lloyd has decided to introduce a Security Manifest Documentation Fee (SMD) subject to FMC filing:

- **USD 30 per Maritime Transport Document and**
- **USD 30 for any amendment of data filed already**

The charge is applicable from February 1, 2012.
