

■ Shanghai – Import Declaration of Hazardous Cargo

Dear Customer,

The Shanghai Maritime Authority (SMA) has served notice that effective immediately all hazardous import cargo must be declared to them 72 hours prior to vessel arrival by the consignee or consignee's agent.

Failure to do so will result in shipments not being discharged upon vessel arrival or the vessel not being able to berth.

Please note that it is the responsibility of the consignee or their agent(s) to ensure the declaration is made within the required timeframe.

Any additional costs incurred due to a failure to declare the cargo within the required timeframe will be for the account of the cargo.

Hapag-Lloyd requires from the consignee or consignee's agent a copy on the "Safety and Fitness of Hazardous cargo". Please send a copy to the local Hapag-Lloyd import ship agent once the declaration is completed.

When declaring hazardous details to the SMA please ensure that details are also provided to Hapag-Lloyds local agent
