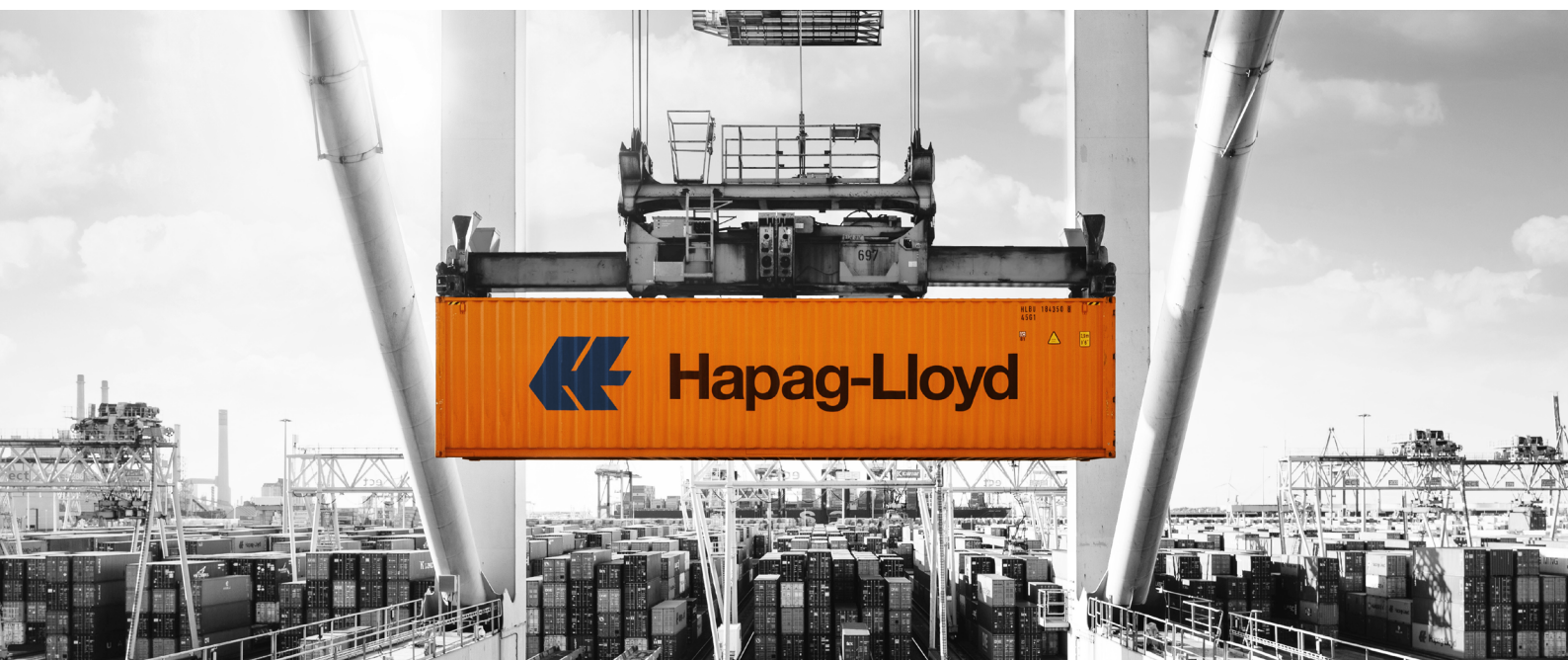

Receive your eBL on the agreed platform once its due. On your chosen platform, you can find all other options. Use our BL Draft Approval tool to easily amend or approve your eBL.
